

Ordinance No. 11 /2021

Director of the Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński

of 25 May 2021

on the Regulations for Visiting the Exhibition of the Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński.

Pursuant to § 11 paragraph 4 pts 4 of the Statute of the Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński of May 12, 2016, I hereby order the following:

§ 1

I introduce the ordinance regarding the Regulations for Visiting **the Permanent Exhibition of the Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński** in the wording set out in Annex 1 to this ordinance.

§ 2

1. With repealed preordaining Museum Director No. 6/2020 of 31 .01.2020 r., preordaining Director of the Museum 1 6 /2020 dated 05.07.2020 r., preordaining Director of the Museum No. 26 /2020 dated 22.09.2020 r. And preordaining Museum Director No. 4 /2021 ex dated 02.11.2021 r. on the Rules of Visiting Exhibitions Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński.
2. This Ordinance shall enter into force on June 1, 2021 .

REGULATIONS FOR VISITING THE PERMANENT EXHIBITION
MUSEUM OF JOHN PAUL II AND PRIMATE WYSZYŃSKI
(hereinafter: "Regulations")

I hereby introduce the Regulations for Visiting the Exhibition of Mt 5.14 | Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński in force from June 1, 2021 until further notice.

1. **From Tuesday to Sunday (without Mondays)**, the Museum of John Paul II and Primate Wyszyński (hereinafter referred to as the "Museum") can be visited, after purchasing tickets for a specific time:

- 1) individual tourists,
- 2) organized groups of no more than 15 people.

2. For security reasons, due to the force in the Republic of Polish epidemic proportions in connection with infection with SARS-CoV virus-2 (hereinafter "COVID-19") in a building Museum may be present at the same time not more than 120 people, the principle : 1 person for 15 m² .

3. The Museum provides reservations for entries for specific hours.

4. Museum can provide:

- 1) system sharing service and audio guides with headphones ;
- 2) guide service ordered at least 7 days in advance
- 3) it is not possible to use the guide service without prior reservation.

5. The Museum spaces non-introduction of prams, bicycles, scooters and other equipment and items that can cause epidemiological risk associated with COVID-19.

6. People entering and moving around the Museum are required to disinfect their hands immediately after entering the building, to cover their mouth and nose and wear gloves until they leave the building.

7. In Museum is strictly forbidden to bring firearms and sharp tools and dangerous.

8. Qualified security staff on the basis of the powers under the Act of 22 August 1997. *On the protection of persons and property* (ie. /Journal of Laws/Dz. U. of 2020. Pos. 838 .) Have the right to intervene and call to leave Museum by persons which do not comply with this Regulations. Visitors are not entitled to any claims in this respect. Persons entering the Museum and their luggage could be checked, among other things, using electronic devices to detect dangerous objects and materials. Persons who refuse to submit to the inspection will not be allowed to enter the Museum area .

9. The maximum size bags and backpacks allowed to contribute to Museum is 30 x 22 x 15 cm. Larger bags and backpacks may not be brought into the exhibition area. The museum does not offer the possibility of depositing bags, backpacks or any other items until the Museum cloakroom opens.

10. Persons under the age of 16 and children can stay in the area Museum only accompanied by their guardians. Visitors who take care of minors are fully responsible for any damage caused by them.

11. Tourist traffic in Museum takes place along a designated route in one direction, maintaining safe distances between visitors (min. 1.5 m).

12. The sightseeing route begins and ends with the passage through the turnstiles. At the entrance and at the exit from the Museum in the ticket office area, the valid admission ticket to the Museum must be presented to the reader.

13. The museum is located at the height of the eighth floor, this route is covered by an elevator, which can accommodate a maximum of 1 person at a time - individual tour. The exceptions are families and people who came to the tour in their groups.

14. There are bicycle parking lots within the complex, on the northern square. It is forbidden to leave bicycles, scooters and other devices or things outside the designated area.

15. The Museum is not responsible for bikes, scooters, etc. in the left Museum and adjacent areas.

16. **Thursday** is the day of free tickets only for individual visitors, without a guide, issued for a specific time, where:

- 1) the number of tickets is limited;
- 2) one person is entitled to one free ticket;

17. **Visitors of Museum are kindly asked to :**

- 1) Following the instructions and comments of the Museum employees who are responsible for the safety of monuments and tourists;
- 2) use of personal protective equipment (disposable gloves, masks).

18. In the event of damage to the object, the visitor covers the costs of its maintenance, repair or replacement.

19. Every visitor to the Museum is obliged to follow the safety rules set out in the Regulations and the instructions of the staff.

20. The following prohibitions apply in the Museum:

- 1) bring a firearm;
- 2) bring dangerous and sharp objects;
- 3) entering and bringing animals (with the exception of a guide dog);
- 4) smoking tobacco and electronic cigarettes;
- 5) eating and drinking;
- 6) use of open fire;
- 7) bringing and consuming alcohol or intoxicants, and sightseeing after drinking alcohol or intoxicating substances;

- 8) conducting telephone conversations with the use of mobile devices;
- 9) touching the exhibits and elements of interior design and walls;
- 10) sit on furniture and destroy elements of the Museum equipment;
- 11) running, jumping and sliding on floors, inclined and steep surfaces;
- 12) behaving loudly, disturbing the peace of other visitors, creating a threatening situation;
- 13) conducting commercial, advertising or political activity;
- 14) photographing and filming indoors with the use of flash lamps, additional lighting, tripods and other accessories necessary for professional photography and filming (except as described below) ;
- 15) photographing and filming the elements of security systems at the exhibits and in the exhibition halls.

21. We inform that:

- 1) **photographing and filming in the interiors of Museum is possible** , provided that:
 - a) it does not interfere with tourist traffic and does not disturb other visitors,
 - b) does not damage the monuments and equipment Museum,
 - c) does not cause damage to other visitors (physical or related to the protection of their personal rights);
- 2) The photographic material or film can not be used for commercial purposes without prior consent Museum;
- 3) it is forbidden to photograph and film parts of the security systems in Museum;
- 4) because of the requirements for the protection and preservation of physical property museum is forbidden to use in indoor Museum flashes, additional lighting, tripods (arm), and other devices;
- 5) The exceptions to the prohibitions in items 2) and 4) above, require the consent of the individual the Director Museum;
- 6) Museum is not liable for infringement by third parties of tourists' personal rights or causing other damage to them due to taking photographs and filming;
- 7) Museum may prohibit photographing and filming these objects, which the owner has not given permission to do so;
- 8) any organizing artistic and economic organization of meetings, action advertising promotions throughout the museum requires individual consent the Director Museum ;
- 9) the exhibition area may be designated (due to the safety of the objects), which will be completely prohibited from photographing and filming.

22. Events held at the Museum can be recorded by the organizer in the form of videos or photos in order to inform about the activities of Museum and its documentation and promotion. Recordings and photos from the events can be published on the website. Museum, on social media and information materials prepared and distributed by Museum.

23. Note to visitors that the introduction of the Interior Museum animals other than guide dogs is prohibited, as a result of concern for the safety of all visitors and monuments.

24. We inform that person disturbing the peace and order and not in compliance with this Regulations be denied the right to explore Museum without refund of admission.

25. We note that the space Museum are constantly monitored by staff supervision, cameras and security systems.

26. Please respect the rules of work of the supervisory staff, who are not obliged to provide information, because their task is primarily the protection of monuments.

27. The last admission to the exhibition takes place 1 hour before its closing.

28. The purchase of a ticket and entry to the premises of the Museum constitutes acceptance of all provisions of these Regulations by all visitors.
